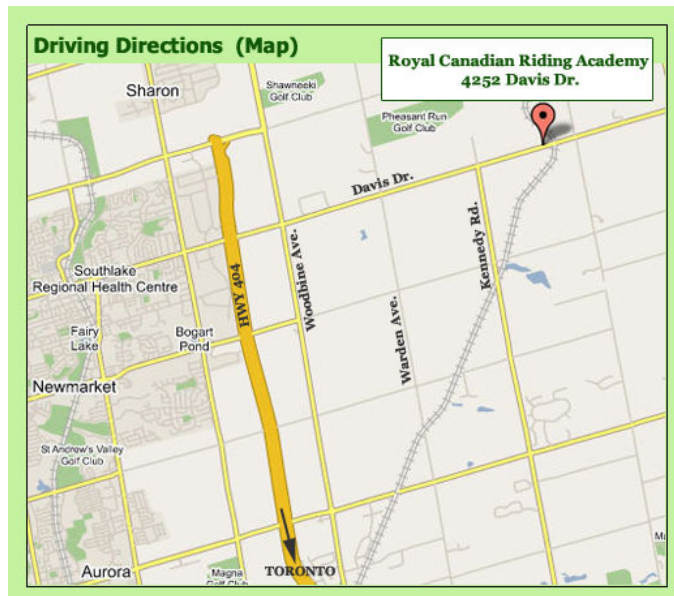
Directions to Royal Canadian Riding Academy:

Sweepstakes is open to All Breeds and Mixed Breeds 12 months of age or older. Entrants may be shown by owners or agents.

The first 7 minutes of each hour will be used for walk throughs, after which, dogs will run small to tall.

The following heights, in inches, will be provided: 4, 8, 12, 16, 20, 24. Dogs that jump their normal CKC jump height are assessed zero faults. Dogs that jump lower than their normal CKC jump height, are assessed 10 faults per lower jump height. NO faults are assessed for dogs jumping higher than their eligible CKC jump height.

Scores are based on dog's time plus 5 faults for each of these infractions as they occur: refusal, wrong course, dropped bar, missed contact, each occurrence of training in the ring. A non completion will be given an NQ, 100 points deducted.

Toys and gentle leading of dogs by their collar may be used during the sweepstakes run, which is considered training in the ring. Please, NO FOOD as the ring will be used for the trial the next day.

All dogs are assessed on their COMBINED score from two runs. Each dog may only run twice in the sweepstakes.

Division of entry money as prizes

50% of the money will be retained by the club for expenses. The remaining 50% will be divided as follows:

- First.....50%
- Second.....25%
- Third.....10%
- Fourth.....5%

After deducting for Class Awards, remaining monies will be awarded in the form of an armband draw prize or prizes. No ribbons will be provided for sweeps winners.

The Agility Trial Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit, on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred..

General Information	The Trial Secretary and Superintendent is in full charge of the Trials. The show precincts shall consist of the indoor arena area. Food and toys are not permitted in the course area and handlers are not permitted to use whistles, clickers, flexis or other instruments or devices in the ring or within 10 feet of the course. Bitches in Season are also NOT permitted in the arena, parking lot or anywhere on the RCRA property. Dogs <u>must</u> be ON LEASH at all times when outside the ring.
Event Information	Ring Surface is dirt floor. One side of ring is separated from exhibitors and benching by gating. Benching is also available in a separate area from the rings. There is also a heated observation area which dogs are not allowed in and stadium style spectator seating in the arena. Handlers in all classes will be able to walk their course for 7 minutes only, without their dog prior to the start of the class. ELECTRONIC TIMING will be used at these trials. Handlers must be ready at the start line when called or risk forfeiting their run. If a dog is not at ringside after it has been called 3 times, it will be marked absent. Obstacle familiarization will be available for Novice classes immediately prior to the first Novice Standard class of EACH day. Only those dogs who are NOT entered on Saturday may participate in the Sunday familiarization.
Obstacles	Obstacles shall meet the specifications in the CKC Agility Rules and Regulations effective January 1, 2010. Please note, there are several changes and exhibitors are advised to read the new rulebook to become aware of them.
Eligibility	To be eligible to compete in these trials, a dog must be 18 mos. of age and registered or be eligible for registration with the CKC, have an ERN or CKC Miscellaneous Certificate or Performance Event Number (PEN) Spayed bitches, debarked dogs, and neutered males are eligible to participate.
Bitches in Season	Bitches in season may not compete. When a bitch comes into season after the entry has closed a Veterinarian's certificate, certifying the bitch was in season within the 10-day period preceding the trial must reach the secretary on or before the start of the trial. A full refund of entry fees and listing fees will be given.
Trophies	Ribbons will be given for 1st through 4th qualifying scores in all Jump Heights. New Title Rosettes will be offered.
Food Concession	The RCRA has a full service restaurant and canteen. There are also several fast food and sit down restaurants close-by in Newmarket.

Move-ups will be allowed after the closing date. For Trial 1 move-ups must be received by the trial secretary no later then Nov 17th . For all other trials move-ups must be received a minimum of 15 minutes after the class the title was completed in.

Alterations, substitutions or cancellations of any entry after the closing date is prohibited, except as noted in this premium list. **The ONLY exception is bitches in season. Unfortunately we can not refund any entries, after closing, for injured dogs or any other reason.**

Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom the entries were made.

Judging schedules will be mailed or emailed as soon as possible after the closing date. They will also be posted on our website.

Tendering of NSF cheque is considered as non-payment of fees and is punishable by disciplinary action. Any NSF cheque will be subject to a \$40.00 service charge.

Foreign Exhibitors

Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, in US funds. Please do not mark personal cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated. Thank you.

HELP WANTED

Job Descriptions

Gate Steward: Makes sure exhibitors are at the gate, in the correct order and ready to run

Ring Steward: Sets bars to correct positions prior to each jump height in a class. Re-sets dropped bars, straightens chute

Leash Runner: Takes exhibitor's leash from start line and places it at finish

Scribe: Marks faults on scribe sheet as they are called by the judge

Timer: Times the dogs' runs using electronic timing.

Scribe Assistant (will be used if trials are very large): Hands scribe correct scribe sheet, writes time on scribe sheet, and hands sheet to sheet runner.

Course Builder: Assists the Chief Course Builder with putting obstacles in the correct position as indicated by the judge

Drinks and snacks will be provided for all those who work.

A volunteer raffle will be held at the end of each day.

Are you in the correct Class?

Selected Class: Any dog eligible to enter an agility trial may enter the Selected Class but can not be entered in the Selected Class and Regular Class at the same set of trials. Dogs entering the Selected Class must progress through the various levels beginning with the Novice level. When entering this class your dog will jump one jump height lower than its Regular jump height and this class will get 10% more time than the Regular Standard course time. For full rules on the Selected Class please refer to the Official CKC Agility rule book.

Please note: Novice JWW will have one set of 6 weave poles used once.

Novice A is for persons and dogs that have never acquired an agility title in any country or with any organization.

Novice B is for agility instructors and judges, and for dogs that have acquired the Novice title, but have not earned a qualifying score in Agility Intermediate; and for persons who have previously exhibited a dog to an agility title in any agility organization.

Excellent A is for dogs that have acquired the Intermediate title, but have not yet earned the Agility Excellent title in either Standard or JWW.

Excellent B is for dogs that have acquired the Excellent title or the Master Excellent Title. A dog may move up into Excellent B in only the Standard or JWW class that they have earned an Excellent Title in.

Veteran Classes (affective January 1, 2010):

8.5.1 At the option of the handler, a dog 7 years of age or older may be entered in the Veterans Class. Once a dog has been designated as a Veteran and entered in this class, the dog cannot revert/transfer back to the Regular or Selected Classes. The dog will retain titles and/or Qualifying scores towards titles accumulated. Any new titles earned will be designated with the letter 'V' for Veteran following the title (e.g. AGMXV).

8.5.2 All veterans will compete as if running in the Selected Classes at one or two jump heights lower than regular and with the 10% additional time allocated for the Selected Class.

8.5.3 Veterans Classes run the same courses as the Regular and Selected Classes and dogs entered in these classes run concurrently in the respective jump heights.

Judges' Profiles

Gayle Avery:

Gayle has been involved with AAC since before it was AAC and was called ADAC. She went to the first judging clinic before there was even a Masters class and the first Masters clinic, attended by only three judges. Gayle led the committee for one of the first AAC rule books and has been a course approver since its inception. Gayle has judged all across Canada, with her first away assignment being in Halifax and has since judged AAC trials across the country through to Vancouver. Gayle has also judged the AAC Regional for Nova Scotia, Quebec, Alberta, the 2007 Regional in Ontario and has judged the Nationals in Montreal. When CKC started doing agility, she became a CKC judge and has since judged CKC trials from Moncton to Vancouver Island and even up to Grande Prairie, Alberta. Three years ago, she was also fortunate enough to be asked to judge in Puerto Rico for FCI. Although the judging is different in these types of agility, she feels the people are the same: warm, friendly and crazy about their dogs and agility.

Sharon Dunsmore:

Was educated as a Clinical Nurse Educator for Critical Care Units. but has slowly changed her long time hobby with dogs into a large successful business and left the nursing profession. A professional dog trainer for the past 20 years, Sharon currently runs K9 Klubhouse Dog Services, organizes and runs about 7-9 agility trials per year both for CKC and AAC and is a CKC and AAC agility judge. In addition, for the past 25 years, Sharon has been breeding, showing and playing various dog sports with her Bearded Collies and has a huge interest in the many issues that face reputable breeders today.
